*C. Lord Lovat, Rebel Convicts,
Scotland, &c.*

1. On Thursday a Respite, to Tuesday the 10th of March, was granted to the sixteen following Rebels, lately convicted of High Treason, at St. Margaret's-Hill, viz. Francis Farquharson, Walter Mitchel, Thomas Watson, George Ramsey, James Lindsey, Allen Cameron, Sir James Kinloch, Alexander Mac Lauchlan, George Abenethy, Hector Mac Kenzie, John Burnet, Roderic Mac Culloch, Charles Gordon, John Farquharson, James Gordon, James Stewart. 2. On Monday the Hon. the House of Commons met pursuant to their Adjournment, and Tuesday the Right Hon. the House of Peers met; at Noon the Lord Lovat was, carried from the Tower to the Bar of the House, when he gave in his Answer. to the Articles of Impeachment which were al- ledged against him. 3. Monday Mr.. Caverly, one of his Majesty's Messengers arrived Express from Scotland, at his Grace the Duke of Newcastle's Office, Whitehall. 4. By the last Messenger that came from Edinburgh we have certain Accounts, that all is quiet in the Highlands, so that the Report of some hundreds having got together and the French having landed some Forces, is without Foundation.
